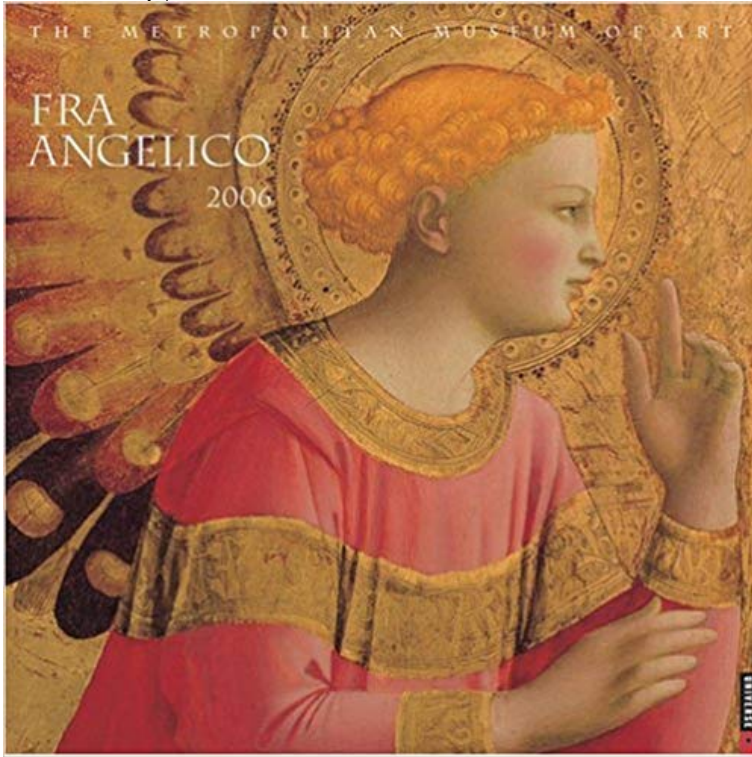


Fra Angelico
