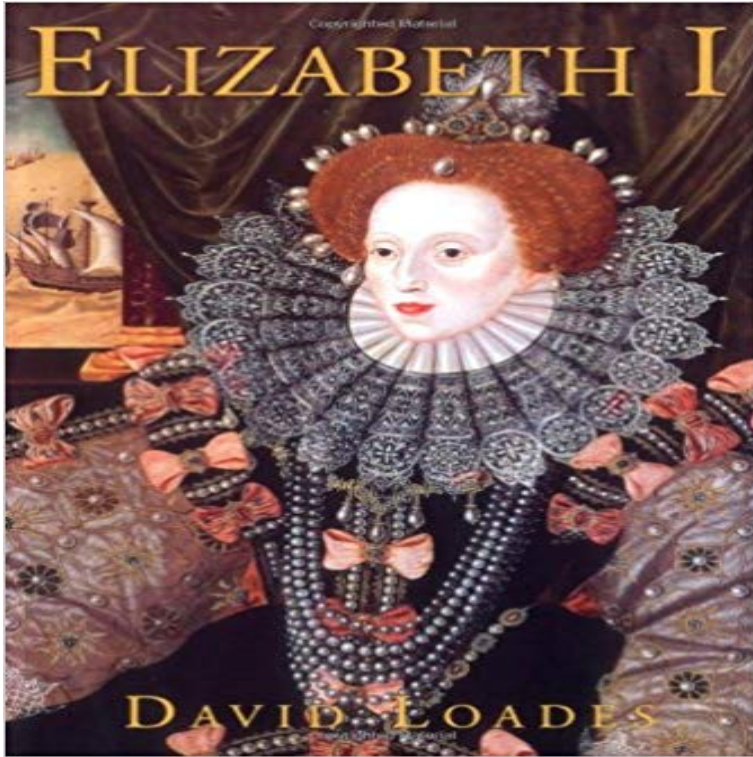


Elizabeth I
