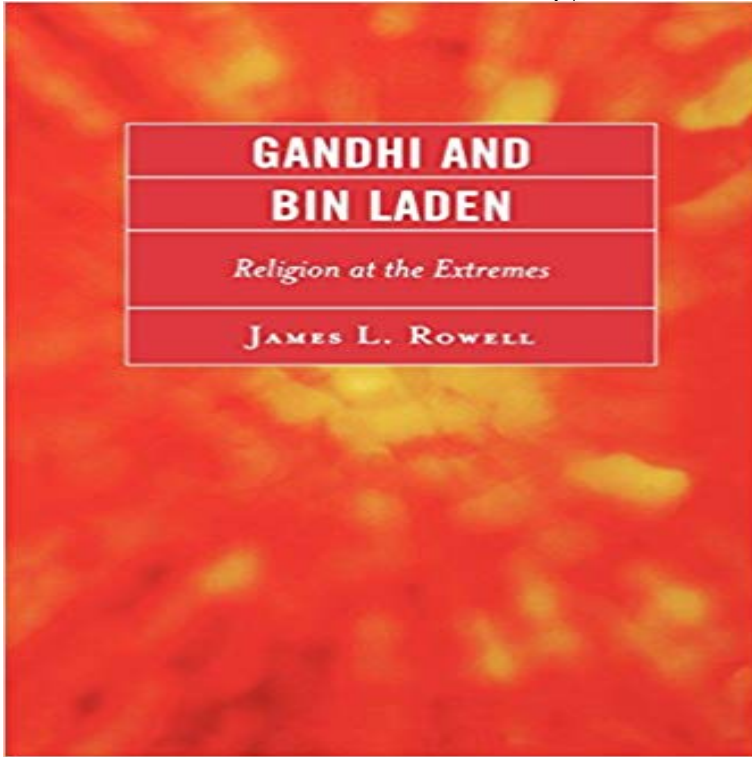


# Gandhi and Bin Laden: Religion at the Extremes
