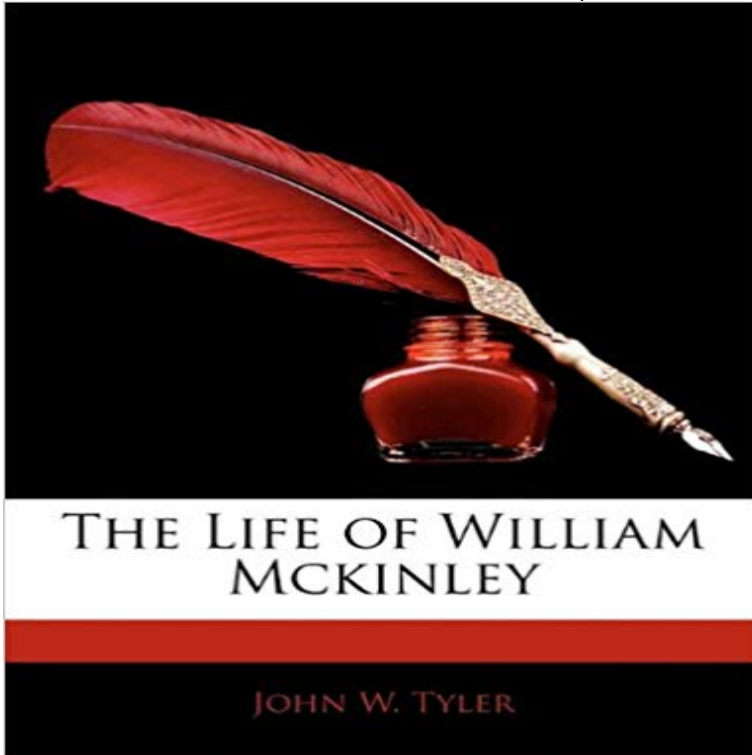


# The Life of William McKinley

Key events in the life of William McKinley (January 29, 1843 September 14, 1901) was the 25th President of the United States, serving from March 4, 1897 until his assassination in September 1901, six months into his second term.
